

UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS College of Fine and Applied Arts

The core of most of the degree programs in the College of Fine and Applied Arts consists of studio courses that are sequenced, meaning the first course is a prerequisite for the second, which is a prerequisite for the third, etc. The sequences tend to start in the fall semester. Thus, **the majority of Fine and Applied Arts programs are open for fall transfer only.**

Due to sequencing within the College of Fine + Applied Arts curriculum, students are encouraged to contact the school they intend to transfer to as early as possible to map out a course plan. Depending on the community college, you may be able to transfer and finish in 2 + 2 years, while others may work best with a 1 + 3 plan. In all cases, finishing required general education courses before transferring is encouraged. Please visit faa.illinois.edu to see our list of existing community college articulations. Students who cannot start sequenced coursework may not be able to graduate within four years of starting their college degree on this campus. Thus, **for most of the degree programs in the College of Fine and Applied Arts, the application for transfer to Illinois should begin during their first semester of college so they start their sophomore year at Illinois.**

Because professional coursework is required during the first year of study in dance, theatre and music at Illinois, transfer students are urged to take appropriate general education courses (see below) and apply for transfer to Illinois during their first year at a community college. Admission to all performing arts programs require a successful audition, portfolio review and/or interview, in addition to completion of the general education courses required of all FAA transfers with an acceptable transfer **GPA of 2.25 (A=4.00)**. **The academic qualifications and artistic qualifications of applicants are considered equally and both may impact placement in core courses in the student's major.**

Course pattern requirements for admission are expected to be completed prior to the desired term of entry. A student admitted prior to completing the pattern must complete the pattern at the University of Illinois.

Visual Art Portfolio Reviews

Successful admission to all Art and Design majors requires an evaluation of artistic talent and experience, which is determined through portfolio reviews, in addition to an evaluation of the candidate's academic qualifications. **The academic qualifications and artistic qualifications of applicants are considered equally and both may impact placement in core courses in the student's major.**

Music Auditions

The Bachelor of Arts in Music does not require an audition. Additionally, the following majors require an interview: Bachelor of Music in Composition-Theory and Musicology, Bachelor of Music Education, and Bachelor of Arts in Music.

General Education Requirements

All FAA students must fulfill the University of Illinois General Education requirements prior to graduation. Courses which satisfy these categories are constantly changing. The current list is maintained on the Internet at: <https://courses.illinois.edu/gened/2016/fall>. The following admission requirement must be completed prior to transfer.

Language Requirements: All transfer applicants must have completed either through the second level (two years) of one language other than English in high school or through the second level (2 semesters) of one language other than English in college prior to the desired term of entry.

It is strongly encouraged that transfer applicants complete the **Language Requirement** for graduation from this college prior to the desired term of entry, which is completion through the third level (3 years) in high school or third level (3 semesters) in college of one language other than English. Students majoring in Art History, Musicology and Vocal Performance have additional language requirements for satisfying those degree requirements.

Composition I: Generally, a two-course sequence equivalent to the University of Illinois' RHET 105, Writing and Research or a two-course composition sequence articulated as a UCI 1 - - and as a UCII 1 - -.

Quantitative Reasoning I: Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Urban Planning require a specific QR I course equivalent. Students transferring into other majors are free to complete any approved, transferable QR I equivalent course.

Architectural Studies

A five-semester sequence of architectural design is required for this four-year Bachelor of Science in Architectural Studies (BSAS) degree program. Consequently, students should plan on applying for admission after completion of one year at a community college. Several Illinois community colleges have a two-year articulated course agreement in architecture (College of DuPage, Harper College, Illinois Central College, Lewis & Clark Community College and Triton College). There is also a five-year pathway program with Parkland College.

Limited facilities necessitate a quota for the admission of transfer students. **A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.20 (A=4.00) for transferable courses is usually required to be competitive for admission.**

PLEASE NOTE: Course pattern requirements for admission in *red italics* are expected to be completed by the desired term of entry. In rare instances, a student may be admitted before the course pattern is complete. The student will still be obligated to finish the pattern at the University of Illinois prior to degree certification.

Sophomore-level transfer admission requires completion of equivalent transfer coursework to the following University of Illinois courses and requirement prior to enrollment:

MATH 220, Calculus
MATH 231, Calculus II or PHYS 101, College Physics: Mech & Heat
RHET 105, Writing and Research¹
Language Requirement²

Admission requirements for junior-level transfer:

A student should plan to transfer upon the completion of their freshman year unless they are attending one of the community colleges with two-year articulated course agreements previously listed above. If these courses are not available, junior transfers will most likely need to complete three years of coursework at the University of Illinois.

Completion of equivalent transfer coursework which satisfies the following University of Illinois' General Education³ categories prior to transfer is **highly recommended:**

Cultural Studies: Non-Western/U.S. Minority Culture(s) – General Education Requirement
Cultural Studies: Western/Comparative Culture(s) – General Education Requirement

Art and Design Majors

Art Education; Art History; Crafts: Metals; Graphic Design; Industrial Design; New Media; Painting; Photography; and Sculpture

Art students at the University of Illinois may apply to Art Foundations (considered Art Undecided) or directly into their selected major (Art Education, Art History, Ceramics, Graphic Design, Industrial Design, Metals, New Media, Painting, Photography or Sculpture). Students transferring to the University of Illinois for one of the above art majors will be evaluated for entry to both the Art Foundation program and to a specific major. Those who have completed most of the coursework of the Art Foundation program may be eligible for direct entry to one of the majors. Those who are not ready for entry to a major (due to missing course pattern requirements, or because the portfolio indicates the student is not yet ready for entry to a major) will be considered for entry to Art Foundation. **A portfolio is required for entry into any art program, including Art Foundation**, and may impact placement in courses required for the degree.

Application to any art major after the first year is highly recommended because the student will be in sequenced courses for three additional years to complete their BFA. The School of Art + Design currently has a 2+2 pathway program in place with Parkland College for the following programs – Art Education, History of Art, Graphic Design, Crafts: Metals, New Media, Painting, Photography and Sculpture.

Suggested requirements for admission are a grade-point average of 3.00 or higher (A=4.00) and a successful portfolio.

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Additional requirements for Art Education Transfers

Minimum requirements for admission are a grade-point average of 3.00 or higher (A=4.00), a portfolio and successful completion of the Illinois Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), previously known as the Test of Basic Skills. Effective July 2012, the Illinois State Board of Education determined the ACT Plus Writing/SAT scores can be used in lieu of a passing score on the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP).

Information on how to register for the test is available at www.icts.nesinc.com. **Transfer applicants should register for a test date at least one semester in advance of their University of Illinois enrollment** and ask that the score be reported to the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. **Your application is incomplete without a passing score on this test.** Continuation in the licensure track is dependent on passing a criminal background check and blood-borne pathogens training. These must be completed the first semester on campus.

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Art Foundation

Undecided majors who have not completed the recommended sequence of courses for admission directly to an art major (**See Page 4**) should apply for admission to the Art Foundation program, which includes courses in drawing 2D, 3D and 4D practices. Undecided majors will declare their Art + Design major March 1 of their first year of study. Students admitted to the Art Foundation program should anticipate an additional 8 semesters of study in sequenced courses to complete the degree of Bachelor of Fine Arts.

A **portfolio review** is **required** for admission to the Art Foundation program.

Suggested requirements for admission are a grade point average of 3.00 or higher (A=4.00) and a successful portfolio review.

In rare instances, a student may be admitted before the course pattern is complete. The student will still be obligated to finish the pattern at the University of Illinois prior to degree certification.

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Dance

Application after the first year is **highly recommended** because the student will be in sequenced courses for three additional years to complete the degree of Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance. The University of Illinois' Dance curricula sequences begin in the fall semester; consequently, transfers are strongly encouraged to apply for fall enrollment. Dance does currently have a 2+2 pathway program with Parkland College. An audition is required for admission.

Requirements for admission are a grade point average of 2.25 (3.00 or higher - Preferred) (A=4.00) and completion of an audition.

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Landscape Architecture

Landscape Architecture is a 4+ year program of study, 4 years of study, plus a required summer internship.

A cumulative grade point average of 2.50 (A=4.00) for transferable courses is usually required to be competitive for admission.

PLEASE NOTE: Course pattern requirements for admission in *red italics* are expected to be completed by the desired term of entry. In rare instances, a student may be admitted before the course pattern is complete. The student will still be obligated to finish the pattern at the University of Illinois prior to degree certification.

Students are **advised** to transfer after one year of study at a regionally-accredited, post-secondary institution because of the specific course structure of this program of study.

Sophomore-level transfer admission requires completion of equivalent transfer coursework to the following University of Illinois courses and requirement:

***MATH 112, Algebra and MATH 114, Trigonometry
or MATH 115, Preparation for Calculus or a higher level Mathematics course
RHET 105, Writing and Research¹
Language Requirement²***

Music Majors

Bachelor of Arts with a Major in Music; Jazz Studies; Music Education; Musicology; Music Performance-Instrumental or Voice

The information below applies to **all** music majors at the University of Illinois. Additional information for Music Education majors is listed on page 9.

Application after the first year is **highly recommended** because the student will be in sequenced courses for three additional years to complete the degree of Bachelor of Music or Bachelor of Music Education at the University of Illinois. The University of Illinois' Music curricula sequences begin in the fall semester; consequently, transfers are only accepted for fall enrollment. Transfer students interested in the Spring term should show transcript history of music theory, aural skills and music history.

Minimum requirements for admission are a grade point average of 2.25 (3.00 or higher - Music Education) (A=4.00) and completion of the supplemental Music application, which may include a successful audition, interview and/or placement exam.

Transfer credit for all music skills toward any music degree will be subject to audition or placement exam.

PLEASE NOTE: Course pattern requirements for admission in *red italics* are expected to be completed by the desired term of entry. In rare instances, a student may be admitted before the course pattern is complete. The student will still be obligated to finish the pattern at the University of Illinois prior to degree certification.

Sophomore-level transfer admission requires completion of equivalent transfer coursework to the following University of Illinois course and requirements:

*General Education Requirement*²
*Language Requirement*³ – (General Education Requirement)

Admission requirements for Junior-level transfer:

Students should plan to transfer upon the completion of their freshman year, since transfer students will need to complete three years of coursework at the University of Illinois for graduation.

Completion of similar coursework or transfer equivalents to the following University of Illinois courses is recommended prior to transfer:

Additional Requirements for Music Education Transfers

Minimum requirements for admission are a grade-point average of **3.00** or higher (**A=4.00**), a successful interview (a phone interview may be arranged for out-of-state students), an audition, and successful completion of the Illinois Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), previously known as the Test of Basic Skills. Effective July 2012, the Illinois State Board of Education determined the ACT Plus Writing/SAT scores can be used in lieu of a passing score on the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP).

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Theatre

Application after the first year is **highly recommended** because the student will be in sequenced courses for three additional years to complete the degree of Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre. The University of Illinois' Theatre curricula sequences begin in the fall semester; consequently, transfers are only accepted for Theatre for fall enrollment.

Requirements for admission are a grade point average of 2.25 (3.00 or higher - Preferred) (A=4.00) and completion of an audition, portfolio or interview.

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Urban Planning

A grade-point average of 2.75 (A=4.00) is recommended for admission. However, competition for admission to this major frequently requires a grade-point average of **3.00 or higher (A=4.00)**.
