

UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS College of Fine + Applied Arts

The core of most of the degree programs in the College of Fine + Applied Arts consists of studio courses that are sequenced, meaning the first course is a prerequisite for the second, which is a prerequisite for the third, etc. The sequences tend to start in the fall semester. Thus, **for most of the degree programs in the College of Fine + Applied Arts, the application for transfer to Illinois should begin during the first semester of college so students may start their sophomore year at Illinois.**

Students are encouraged to contact the school into which they intend to transfer as early as possible to map out a course plan. Depending on the community college, students may be able to transfer and finish in 2 + 2 years, while others may work best with a 1 + 3 plan. In all cases, finishing required general education courses before transferring is encouraged.

Course pattern requirements for admission should be completed prior to the desired term of entry. A student admitted prior to completing the pattern must complete the pattern at the University of Illinois and will likely spend more time on campus to complete their program.

Performing Arts Talent Reviews

Admission to performing arts programs requires talent submissions - audition, portfolio review and/or interview, in addition to completion of the general education courses required of all FAA transfers with an acceptable transfer **GPA of 2.25 (A=4.00)**. Only the BA in Music and Music + options **do not** require a specific talent submission. Students applying to the BA in Music and Music+ are expected to clearly articulate their major goals and experience in their essay. **The academic qualifications and artistic qualifications of applicants are considered equally and both may affect placement in core courses in the student's major.**

Visual Art Portfolio Reviews

Successful admission to all Art and Design majors requires an evaluation of artistic talent and experience, which is determined through portfolio reviews, in addition to an evaluation of the candidate's academic qualifications. **The academic qualifications and artistic qualifications of applicants are considered equally and both may affect placement in core courses in the student's major.**

Architecture, landscape architecture and urban planning **do not** require a talent submission.

General Education Requirements

All FAA students must fulfill the University of Illinois General Education requirements prior to graduation. Courses that satisfy these categories are constantly changing. The current list is maintained on the Internet at: <https://courses.illinois.edu/gened/2018/fall>. The following admission requirement must be completed prior to transfer.

Language Requirements: All transfer applicants should have completed either through the second level (two years) of one language other than English in high school or through the second level (2 semesters) of one language other than English in college prior to the desired term of entry.

It is strongly encouraged that transfer applicants complete the **Language Requirement** for graduation from this college prior to the desired term of entry, which is completion through the third level (3 years) in high school or third level (3 semesters) in college of one language other than English. Students majoring in Art History, Musicology and Vocal Performance have additional language requirements for satisfying those degree requirements.

Composition I: Generally, a two-course sequence equivalent to the University of Illinois' RHET 105, Writing and Research or a two-course composition sequence articulated as a UCI 1- - and UCII 1- -.

Quantitative Reasoning I: Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Urban Planning require a specific QR I course equivalent. Students transferring into other majors are free to complete any approved, transferable QR I equivalent course.

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Architectural Studies

A five-semester sequence of architectural design is required for this four-year Bachelor of Science in Architectural Studies (BSAS) degree program. Consequently, students should plan to apply for admission after completion of one year at a community college. Several Illinois community colleges have a two-year articulated course agreement in architecture (College of DuPage, Harper College, Illinois Central College, Lewis & Clark Community College and Triton College). There is also a five-year pathway program with Parkland College.

Limited facilities necessitate a quota for the admission of transfer students. **A suggested cumulative GPA of 3.00 (A=4.00) for transfer coursework is usually required to be competitive for admission.**

PLEASE NOTE: Course pattern requirements for admission in *bold, red italics* should be completed by the desired term of entry. In rare instances, a student may be admitted before the course pattern is complete. The student will still be obligated to finish the pattern at the University of Illinois prior to degree certification.

Sophomore-level transfer admission requires completion of equivalent transfer coursework to the following University of Illinois courses and requirement prior to enrollment:

Admission requirements for junior-level transfer:

A student should plan to transfer upon the completion of their freshman year, unless they are attending a community college with two-year course plans with our School of Architecture. If sophomore-level required courses are not completed, junior transfers will most likely need to complete three years of coursework at the University of Illinois. The School of Architecture also has a 2 + 3 pathway with Parkland College.

Completion of equivalent transfer coursework, which satisfies the following University of Illinois' General Education categories³, prior to transfer is **highly recommended:**

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Art and Design Majors

Art Education; Art History; Crafts: Metal (Jewelry Design); Graphic Design; Industrial Design; New Media; Painting; Photography; Sculpture; and Studio Art

Art students at the University of Illinois may apply to Art Foundations (considered Art Undecided) or directly into their selected major (Art Education, Art History, Graphic Design, Industrial Design, Metal, New Media, Painting, Photography, Sculpture or Studio Art). Students transferring to the University of Illinois for one of the above art majors will be evaluated for entry to both the Art Foundation program and to a specific major. Those who have completed most of the coursework of the Art Foundation program may be eligible for direct entry to one of the majors. Those who are not ready for entry to a major (due to missing course pattern requirements or because the portfolio indicates the student is not yet ready for entry to a major) will be considered for entry to Art Foundation. **A portfolio is required for entry into any art program, including Art Foundation**, and may affect placement in courses required for the degree.

Application to any BFA art major after the first year is highly recommended because the student will be in sequenced courses for three additional years to complete their degree. The School of Art + Design currently has a 2+2 pathway program in place with Parkland College for the following programs – Art Education, History of Art, Graphic Design, Crafts: Metal (Jewelry Design), New Media, Painting, Photography and Sculpture.

Suggested requirements for admission are a GPA of 3.00 or higher (A=4.00) and a successful portfolio.

The courses listed below parallel the Art Foundation curriculum in the School of Art + Design at the University of Illinois. The course pattern and General Education requirements for transfer admission in **bold, red italics** should be completed **prior** to the desired term of entry.

RHET 105, Writing and Research¹, Language Requirement², Quantitative Reasoning I³ – (General Education Requirement)

Applicants who *have not* completed a course in each of the required studio categories listed below will be considered for entry to the Art Foundation program. Additionally, an Art History survey class, comparable to University of Illinois' course, **ARTH 110 Introduction to the History of Art and Visual Cultures**, is required.

Additional requirements for Art Education Transfers

Minimum requirements for admission are a GPA of 3.00 or higher (A=4.00) and a portfolio.

ISBE Basic Skills Testing Requirement Prior to Student Teaching or Internship

Prior to proceeding to student teaching/internship in an Illinois Educator Preparation Program at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, prospective candidates must take and pass an Illinois approved test of basic skills. Approved tests consist of the Illinois Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), ACT, or SAT with approved scores. Previously passed Illinois Test of Basic Skills (096, 300, or 400) may be used to meet this requirement.

⁴ Transfer credit for all art skills for application toward the degree will be subject to portfolio review. Art course transfer credit (for accreditation) requires 6 contact hours plus 3 hours of outside work per week for 16 weeks for studio art classes with 3 credit hours.

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Art Foundation

Undecided majors who have not completed the recommended sequence of courses for admission directly to an art major (**See Page 3**) should apply for admission to the Art Foundation program, which includes courses in drawing, 2D, 3D and 4D practices. Undecided majors will declare their Art + Design major March 1 of their first year of study. Students admitted to the Art Foundation program should anticipate additional semesters of study in sequenced courses to complete the degree of Bachelor of Fine Arts. Students with broad studio art interests may also apply to the Bachelor of Arts in Studio Art. This program can typically be completed in 2+2 years if general education and art foundation course requirements are met prior to admission.

A **portfolio review** is **required** for admission to the Art Foundation program.

Suggested requirements for admission are a GPA of 3.00 or higher (A=4.00) and a successful portfolio review.

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Computer Science + Music

The Bachelor of Science in Computer Science + Music is a degree program in the College of Fine + Applied Arts. It is a flexible program for students who plan to pursue technical or professional careers in music technology areas requiring a sound grounding in computer science. Students can use the supporting coursework to prepare for employment immediately upon graduation or for pursuing graduate study in a wide variety of fields.

Transfer Requirements:

Students seeking admission to the CS + Music must meet the following criteria:

- A cumulative grade point average of **3.50 or higher (A=4.00)** is required for admission to Computer Science + Music.
- A minimum grade of A- in each Computer Science course taken.
- Applicants must have a demonstrated interest in Music (coursework and extra-curricular activities)

Language Recommendation: There is no longer a language requirement for transfer admission.

Sophomore-level transfer admission requires completion of equivalent transfer coursework in the following University of Illinois courses:

CS 125, Intro to Computer Science 1

MATH 220, Calculus

MATH 231, Calculus II or CS 173, Discrete Structures

Junior-level transfer admission requires completion of all of the **sophomore-level transfer** requirements and equivalent transfer coursework to the following University of Illinois courses:

MATH 241, Calculus III

CS 225, Data Structures

Music courses taken at another institution are reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Applicants must submit an online portfolio that demonstrates their experience and readiness in Computer Science + Music. All portfolios are submitted online. Transfer credit for all music skills toward any music degree will be subject to audition or placement exam.

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Dance

Application after the first year is **highly recommended** due to the sequencing of dance courses in the Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) program.

Illinois Dance also offers a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree, which requires an additional departmental application. Students interested in the BA in Dance should first apply to the BFA in Dance. They should then immediately contact the Dance Department to request the departmental application for the BA in Dance.

An audition is required for admission for both degree programs.

The University of Illinois' Dance curricula sequences begin in the fall semester; consequently, transfers are strongly encouraged to apply for fall enrollment. Dance does currently have a 2+2 pathway program with Parkland College.

Requirements for admission are a GPA of 2.25 (3.00 or higher - Preferred) (A=4.00) and completion of an audition.

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Landscape Architecture

Landscape Architecture is a 4-plus-year program of study: 4 years of study, plus a required summer internship.

A cumulative GPA of 2.50 (A=4.00) for transferable courses is usually required to be competitive for admission.

PLEASE NOTE: Course pattern requirements for admission in *bold, red italics* should be completed by the desired term of entry. In rare instances, a student may be admitted before the course pattern is complete. The student will still be obligated to finish the pattern at the University of Illinois prior to degree certification.

Students are **advised** to transfer after one year of study at a regionally accredited, post-secondary institution because of the specific course structure of this program of study.

Sophomore-level transfer admission requires completion of equivalent transfer coursework to the following University of Illinois courses and requirement:

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Music Majors

Bachelor of Arts with a Major in Music (BA); includes options in Music Technology, Musicology, Composition, or Music+

Bachelor of Music (BM) with a major in Jazz Performance; Musicology; Composition-Theory, Open Studies, Instrumental Performance or Vocal Performance

Bachelor of Science (BS) with a major in Computer Science + Music

Bachelor of Musical Arts (BMA) with a major in Lyric Theatre

The information below applies to **all** music majors at the University of Illinois. Additional information for Music Education and CS+Music majors is listed on page **10 and 11, respectively**.

Application after the first year is **highly recommended** because the student will be in sequenced courses for three additional years to complete the degree of Bachelor of Music or Bachelor of Music Education at the University of Illinois. The University of Illinois' Music curricula sequences begin in the fall semester; consequently, transfers are strongly recommended for fall enrollment. Transfer students interested in applying for spring admission should show transcript history of music theory, musicianship and music history.

Minimum requirements for admission are a GPA of 2.25 (3.00 or higher recommended for Music Education; 3.50 or higher required for CS+Music) (A=4.00) and completion of the University application, Music supplement, which may include a successful audition and an audition and/or interview.

Transfer credit for all music skills toward any music degree will be subject to audition or placement exam.

PLEASE NOTE: Course pattern requirements for admission in ***bold, red italics*** should be completed by the desired term of entry. In rare instances, a student may be admitted before the course pattern is complete. The student will still be obligated to finish the pattern at the University of Illinois prior to degree certification.

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Admission requirements for Junior-level transfer:

Students should plan to transfer upon the completion of their freshman year, since transfer students will need to complete three years of coursework at the University of Illinois for graduation. Completion of similar coursework or transfer equivalents to the following University of Illinois courses is recommended prior to transfer:

- Ensembles⁴
- Major Instrument or Voice (not necessary for the BA in Music)⁴
- MUS 101, Music Theory and Practice I⁴
- MUS 102, Music Theory and Practice II⁴
- MUS 107, Musicianship I⁴
- MUS 108, Musicianship II⁴
- MUS 110, Intro Art Mus: Int'l Perspect
- MUS 172, Grp Instr Pno for Mus Maj I⁴
- MUS 173, Grp Instr Pno for Mus Maj II⁴

It is recommended that at least four additional General Education requirements be completed (beyond those listed in the *Sophomore-level section*) prior to transfer to Illinois. **Additional Requirements for Music Education (BME) Transfers
Concentrations: Instrumental, Choral, General, or Music Technology**

Minimum requirements for admission are a GPA of 3.00 or higher (A=4.00), a successful interview (a phone interview may be arranged for out-of-state students) and an audition.

In addition to the coursework recommended for all Music majors, Music Education transfers are strongly advised to complete a transfer course equivalent to **PSYC 100, Intro Psych**⁵.

ISBE Basic Skills Testing Requirement Prior to Student Teaching or Internship

Prior to proceeding to student teaching/internship in an Illinois Educator Preparation Program at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, prospective candidates must take and pass an Illinois approved test of basic skills. Approved tests consist of the Illinois Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), ACT, or SAT with approved scores. 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Theatre

Application after the first year is **highly recommended** because the student will be in sequenced courses for three additional years to complete the degree of Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre. The University of Illinois' Theatre curricula sequences begin in the fall semester; consequently, transfers are encouraged to apply for fall enrollment.

Requirements for admission are a GPA of 2.25 (3.00 or higher - Preferred) (A=4.00) and completion of an audition, portfolio or interview.

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Urban Planning

A GPA of 2.75 (A=4.00) is recommended for admission. However, competition for admission to this major frequently requires a GPA of **3.00 or higher (A=4.00)**.
